

Propane Safety

J oan and her sidekick, Jim, (that's because he gets kicked sideways, you know!) attended a very important safety course last September on the care and transport of propane tanks and cylinders. They wish to pass on some important information to you.

First, be constantly aware that propane is an explosive gas. It is kept in liquid form (under pressure) in tanks that may not be used past the expiry date. If you have your own tank, please find out whether your tank is safe to continue using. If the date on the collar of the tank is past, you must not use the tank, by law, unless it has been requalified.

When the gas leaves the tank as a vapor, it is close to -42° C in temperature. That temperature is cold enough to cause major freezing of exposed skin. You are advised to wear neoprene gloves when hooking up the tank to your gas line.

Bottles and tanks are filled to 80% of their capacity with liquid. The other 20% is for vapor. The valve of the bottle or tank is fitted with a neoprene seal that must not be immersed in liquid propane. Therefore, you must not lay the tank on its side. You must store a tank in the upright position se-

curely so that it will not fall down. Secure your tank or tanks with a chain around a post that is set firmly in the ground to ensure that it or they will not fall down. Do not have an open flame near the tanks.

Improperly burned propane can produce carbon monoxide. CO is a highly toxic, invisible and odorless gas that has caused hundreds of deaths. Therefore, check your refrigerator, furnace and stove annually to ensure that they are working properly. Do not tamper with the safety features of your equipment. They are designed to keep you alive. To help you in this regard, we shall ask Panda Propane to come in one day this season to inspect and repair your gas appliances for a fee. Watch for the announcement in the clubhouse.

Because propane is heavier than air and can accumulate in low places, tanks must be stored outdoors. (Many boaters have been blown to Kingdom Come by the ignition of propane in the cabins of their yachts.) Generally, tanks and cylinders must be transported in a trailer. The tank or cylinder must be kept secure and upright during transportation. However, you may transport one 30-pound tank in the trunk of your car. Again, do not let it lie on

Property Taxes on Cabins and Trailers

To those members who have a cabin or trailer at Glen Echo, you may have heard already that the Province of Ontario through the Municipal Property Assessment Corporation (MPAC) is preparing to tax cabins and trailers at private campgrounds. Though the assessment has not taken place at Glen Echo, you should be aware that it is inevitable. According to our information, Glen Echo will be presented with the tax bill and be responsible for payment. Glen Echo will pass the amount owing to each member with a cabin or trailer. The good news is that the amount of tax one has to pay will be rather modest. The bad news is that the tax will be payable from 2004. An information sheet is available for pick-up at the office.

West Nile Virus Prevention and Control

Please note that Glen Echo will be treating all standing water with Aquabac, a larvicide containing Bti. Bti is a bacterium commonly found in many environments. It produces a toxin that disrupts the gut of mosquitoes and black flies in the larval stage. Bti is essentially non-toxic to almost all humans, other mammals, birds and fish. It is rapidly degraded by sunlight.
